## C. Putting a Price on Emissions . What About Economic Competitiveness?

- Competition would be made more fair if each country imposed their emission price on imported as well as domestic products, and refunded it on exported products
- "Next step in global cooperation on climate change should be to clarify these rules




### So What Is the Problem?

- Developing countries fear that % order carbon adjustments+could be used to shift the burden of emission reduction from the wealthier countries to them
- 2. There is a general concern that % order carbon adjustments+could be used as a cover for protectionism

But these concerns can be addressed!



# How It Might Work: Trade from China to the United States



## Measuring Emission Content of Imports and Exports

- Ideally, use actual embedded emission content of product, but
  - 1. Difficult to administer
  - 2. Adverse impact of developing countries
- Better alternative is to assume emission content is the same as similar domestic products
  - 1. Easy administration
  - 2. Developing countries not put at a disadvantage.



### Why Developing Countries Should Support This Proposal

- Focus on consumption shifts more of the responsibility for emissions to the wealthier countries.
- Eventually, helps to enable emission reductions by developing countries, too
