11.d. (1) Introduction of PRLCE

- > promote low-carbon energy policies on supply side like PREE on demand side;
- > promote low-emission power sources such as renewable energy, nuclear and fossil fuel with CCS; and
- > provide recommendations for the host economy.

- Phase 1 (2012-2013): Thailand, the Philippines
- Phase 2 (2013-2014): Indonesia, Malaysia
- Phase 3 (2014-2016): Viet Nam

- Phase 4 (2017-2018): Papua New Guinea
 - The concept note was submitted to the project session 1, 2017;
 - Project proposal to be submitted upon approval in May 2017;
