10.d. (1) Introduction of PREE

PREE consists of three pillars:

- PREE to provide recommendations for the host economy on how implementation of their energy efficiency action plans could be improved, and Follow-up PREE to help a previous PREE host economy to more smoothly implement recommendations on energy efficiency action plans;
- Compendium to share information on energy efficiency policies and performance of APEC economies; and
- Energy Efficiency Policy (EEP) Workshop to further discuss key issues in policy formation for energy efficiency.



10.d. (2) Progress of PREE

1. PREE

PREE Phase 6 in Mexico was conducted on 6-10 March 2017 in Mexico.

2. Compendium

From 2009 to 2015, Compendia were compiled annually (available at: http://aperc.ieej.or.jp/publications/reports/compendium.php).

3. Energy Efficiency Policy (EEP) Workshop

- The 2st EEP Workshop was held in Korea on 27 March 2017 in conjunction with EGEE&C 49.
- The topic was Energy Efficiency Policy and Program Evaluation.



10.d. (3) PREE in Mexico

- 27 participants from Mexico and 6 experts attended.
- Some highlights include:
 - Mexico is implementing a significant energy reform to liberalize energy markets.
 - A growing and increasingly wealthy population is likely to increase energy demand significantly in coming years.
 - Efficiency can provide much needed relief from this growth.
- The final report will be completed before EWG54.

10.d. (4) Energy Efficiency Policy Workshop

- 30 representatives from 15 economies attended.
- Presentations were delivered by consultants from Energy Policy and Programme Evaluation Conferences Ltd - a Notfor-Profit based in the UK.
- Speakers were invited from:
 - > New South Wales Government.
 - Russia's Ministry of Energy;
 - Indonesia's Ministry of Energy;
 - Mexico's Energy Efficiency Commission; and,
 - Lawrence Berkeley National Lab (US).
- Special interest was shown in the groups discussion sessions based on the case study presentations.
- The tentative results were reported and discussed in EGEE&C 49 meeting in Jeju Island, Korea in March 2017.



10.d. (5) Future Plan of PREE

- Plans after the approval of PREE Phase 7 Budget:
 - Compendium 2016 will be published before September 2017.
 - Coordinate the implementation of Follow-up PREE in Malaysia in March/April 2018;
 - Prepare for the 3rd EEP Workshop to be held in conjunction with EGEE&C 51
- There are interests from Russia and Peru to host PREE and Follow-up PREE respectively.
