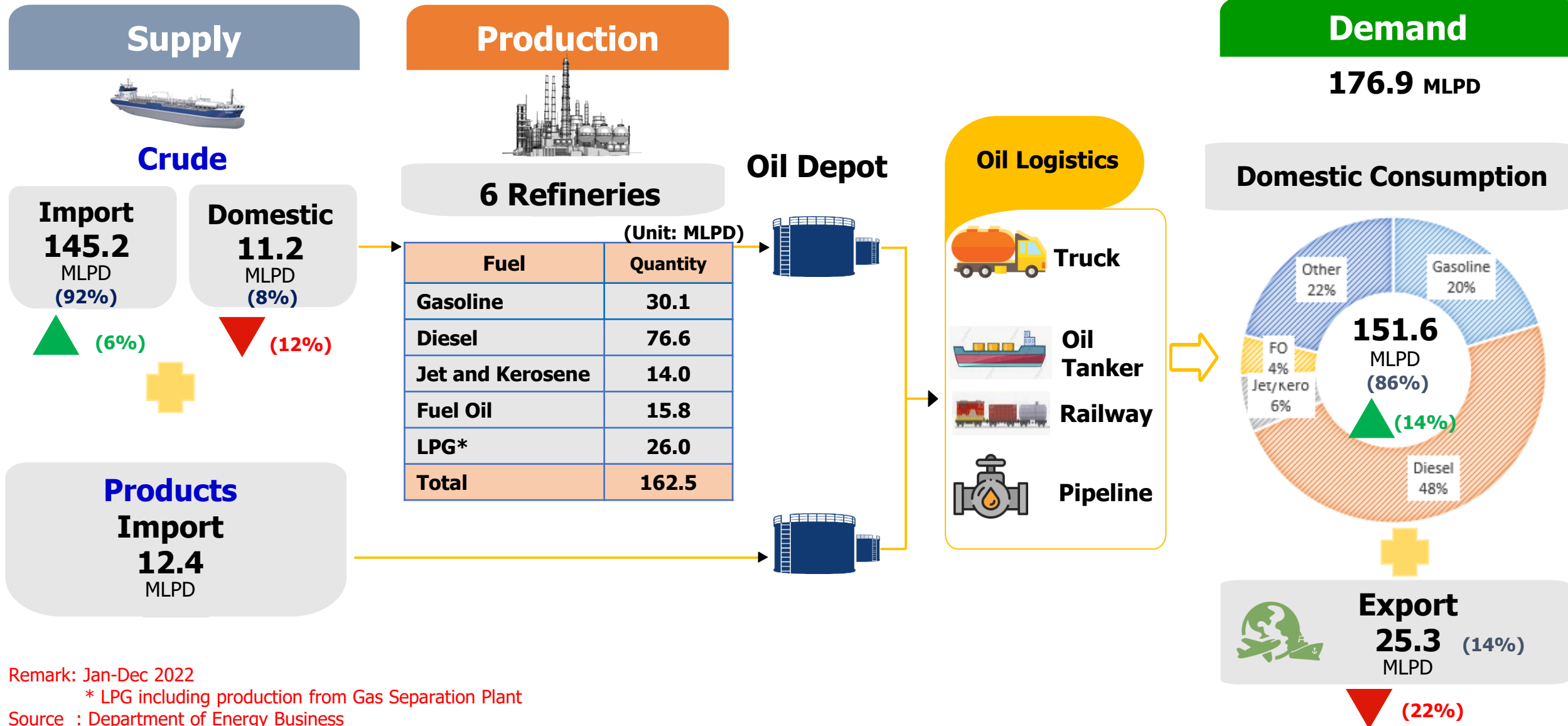

Emergency Level	Level 1	Level 2	Level 3
Description	<p>✓ The situation began to affect the supply.</p>	<p>✓ Remaining fuel stock level (Working Stock + In-Transit) decreases near the critical point of 25 days</p> <p>✓ Supply halts of crude oil for one month.</p>	<p>✓ Inventory levels drop to legal stock levels.</p> <p>✓ Supply halts of crude oil for more than one month.</p>
Measures	<p>Light-handed measures:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Import of crude oil and oil products on a commercial basis - Promotion of the use of mass public transportation instead of private passenger vehicles 	<p>Medium-handed measures:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Import of crude oil and oil products - Surge production in domestic oil fields and the JDA (Petroleum Act.) - Suspension of exports of crude oil and oil products (Section 24) - Relaxation of specification of oil products for import (Section 25) - Increase biofuel blending ratio - Demand restraint 	<p>Heavy-handed measures:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Release of legal reserves - Allocation of oil products to crucial sectors
